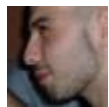

The following year, during a Cook Report documentary he stated: "There is no doubt that hundreds, probably thousands of Jews were shot to death in Eastern Europe, because they were rightly or wrongly seen as communists or potential partisan supporters. That was awful. But this nonsense about gas chambers is exposed as a total lie."

The 2002 Channel 4 documentary *Young, Nazi and Proud* featured hidden-camera footage of the then **BNP** youth leader Mark Collett stating his admiration for Adolf Hitler, and stating

"I'd never say this on camera, the Jews **have** been thrown out of every country including England. It's not just persecution. There's no smoke without fire."

It also featured footage of visitors to the party's annual 'Red White and Blue' festival, some of whom wore the legend "88" (code for HH, "Heil Hitler").

Collett resigned from the party after the documentary's filming, but rejoined shortly afterwards, with Nick Griffin's approval,

Michael (Steele) when most people mention The Holocaust they are generally referring to all its victims, I know I am. No-one is concentrating solely on the Jewish dead. The fact that the Holocaust, as you rightly mention, claimed over 20,000,000 people (for little else than their ethnic identity, sexuality (dis)abilities or politics) only serves to make the crime of denial all the more disgusting. And the fact that members of the **BNP** are on record as denying the Holocaust ever took place is particularly worrying. Why do they deny it? What purpose does it serve **them** and their policies to convince us that the Holocaust did not occur? If the **BNP** are not the Nazi influenced racists of popular imagination as you claim then why do they strive to cover up the Holocaust despite the overriding evidence to the contrary?

Vaughan, yes most political parties **have** "nutcases" as members, as does any significantly large grouping of people. It's a statistical inevitability. However the **BNP** attracts more than its fair share, more than other parties, and to a deeper degree. There are far fewer members of other political parties with conviction for bombmaking, racial assaults, drug dealing, football hooliganism, other violent crimes, threatening behaviour etc. Yes all political parties **have** members or ex-members who **have** criminal records etc, but not as many as the **BNP**, not to the severity of the **BNP**, and when you regard the comparatively smaller size of the **BNP** compared to the vast majority of the other parties this number becomes significantly and statistically magnified. Not only that but the very basis of **BNP** thought and policy itself is vile. Racism, class prejudice (although not so different from the Conservatives in this respect, or even New Labour for that matter, only more so) and overtly and worrying authoritarian stances. There is also much in the politics of the **BNP** that would attract those with criminal and violent tendencies. Plus there is little to suggest that the **BNP** policies are well thought out or viable (**have** you actually considered the logistics of repatriating every non-Northern European in Britain - cost, time, resources, loss of tax revenue, people of mixed race who are as Northern European as they are African/Asian etc and many other such problems.) Many are written solely to attract new members and voters by spreading fear and promising solutions to popular fears - many of which are based on groundless anxiety or **have** been whipped up by the **BNP** and its ilk. For instance the **BNP** claim that we as a nation are exposed to a dangerous threat of Islamic jihadism/terror etc. This is plainly rubbish. There are Islamic fundamentalist terrorists yes, but they only represent a very minimal % of the Muslim population of Britain, and as mentioned above, every population has its nutters. Why should the vast majority of non-fundamentalist Muslims suffer due to the actions of a tiny fraction? (this is before we consider the effects that aggressive US foreign policy had with regards to stirring up/creating Islamic fundamentalism in the first place.) The only purpose it serves is to convince the electorate that there exists a problem to which the **BNP** and its policies are the only answer. This is called Scapegoating and led, as

history shows us, and despite the protestations of people such as the **BNP** to the Holocaust. Perhaps this is why the **BNP** deny the Holocaust as it serves as a tangible reminder of why we should not vote for political parties with openly **racist** policies and an authoritarian stance?

For **me personally** I also fear a **BNP** govt. because history has shown that political parties such as the **BNP** who apply a sheen of respectability over a dangerous past/membership and extremist policies often change their stance once elected.
